Case Research Journal Annual Case Awards



At each annual meeting NACRA recognizes the top three cases published in the Case Research Journal in the previous year and presents the authors of the top case with the prestigious Curtis E. Tate Jr. Award. The process for picking this year's Tate Award winner began with Debbie Ettington, the 2013 CRJ editor, nominating eight cases published in the CRJ in 2013 (Volume 33). The finalist and award winners were then chosen by a committee composed of the three most recent NACRA past presidents (for this year's award that was Vi Narapareddy, Jeff Shay, and Armand Gilinsky).

The recipients of this year's Curtis E. Tate Jr. award were David Roman Coy and Alvaro Gonzalo Hormazábal Reed from ESADE Business School for their excellent case The PCDA Project of Doctors Without Borders- Spain. "PCDA" is the Spanish acronym for Pastillas Contra el Dolor Ajeno (Pills for Other People's Pain). The case outlines the methods employed by the Spanish branch of Médecins sans Frontières, (Doctors Without Borders in English) to develop a physical product that could be used to raise funds for the organization's social initiatives. The PCDA was initially very successful with consumers, and after three months sales had reached three million packets, far exceeding all forecasts. But shortly thereafter, sales plummeted. The case puts students into the shoes of Juan Ramón Axta, the newly appointed head of the PCDA project,

who must decide whether MSF should continue with the project or cancel it. The case was developed for an MBA level Social Marketing course but also has applications in general Marketing and Consumer Behavior courses.

The Tate award comes with a \$2,000 cash prize, which the authors generously donated to the organization about which they wrote the case, Doctors Without Borders.

The two finalists for the 2013 Curtis E. Tate award were the cases Succession in Buchanan Transport Group by Mary Barrett from the University of Wollongong and Ken Moores at Bond University and Caffébene: Master Brewer of Growth and Global Ambition by David Y. Choi and Fred Kiesner of Loyola Marymount University and Byungoh Kang at Chung-Ang University. The first case relates the history of an Australian family transport firm from its foundation through its expansion and diversification into agriculture and tourism, culminating in a business and succession crisis and was written for use in courses in family business. The latter case, written for entrepreneurship courses, focuses on the South Korean coffee company Caffébene and its efforts to compete head to head with Starbucks in the US and a difficult stay-the-course vs. abandon decision as the company experienced a major slipup with its flagship store in the U.S.


